
### NATIONWIDE (U.S.) SURVEY DATA






# How Well Do You Feel Most Businesses and Corporations Will Recover From the Economic Toll of COVID-19?






#### Which Industries Might Benefit from the Halo Effect?

#### People Often Blame Others for Their Problems Rather Than Take Responsibility for Their Own Actions



# WILL HEALTH CONCERNS AFFECT JURY SERVICE?

#### WHO IS LESS LIKELY TO SERVE ON A JURY CURRENTLY?

People most hesitant to report for jury duty include:

- Women
- Under the age of 34 (Millennials and Generation Z)
- Democrats and those with "other" political affiliation
- People with lower household income
- People with minor children
- Homemakers and students

These are stereotypically plaintiff-friendly characteristics.



#### WHO IS MORE LIKELY TO SERVE ON A JURY CURRENTLY?

People <u>least</u> hesitant to report for jury duty include:


- Republicans and Independents
- People with adult children
- People employed full time or retired

These are stereotypically defense-friendly characteristics.

How has the COVID-19 outbreak affected your views of your own safety/vulnerability?




### "REPTILIAN" JURORS

In today's world, juries need to be the "guardians of the community" by forcing companies to change their bad behavior with large damage awards





The primary purpose of awarding damages to a plaintiff (the party that is suing) in a lawsuit is to punish the defendant (the party being sued).






In Recent Months, Some Defendants Have Been Hit With Billion-Dollar Jury Awards. Do You Think These Billion-Dollar Awards Are:





#### **ANCHORING DAMAGES?**

### WHAT DOES THIS ALL MEAN?

#### **CONS:**


 In general, many potential jurors now are more vulnerable – both health-wise and financially – than pre-pandemic, which can make people more plaintiff-friendly.

#### **PROS**:

 However, the most vulnerable, most risk-averse (i.e., most plaintifffriendly) people are less likely to show up for jury duty or to be seated on a jury at present.

# How a Civil Jury Trial in Albuquerque, New Mexico Was Conducted During COVID-19

#### Juror Questionnaires

The court proposed additional questions specifically addressing COVID-19 concerns. A hearing was held and after denying Plaintiff's request to include argumentative questions such as, "Would your concern regarding COVID-19 preclude you from awarding significant damages," the questionnaires were included as part of the summons package.

#### Voir Dire

Conducted in a large room, with groups of 30 jurors at a time. Both parties were precluded from asking anything COVID-19 related, including whether the potential juror was concerned about anyone at home. The court believed such questioning would discourage other potential jurors.

- COVID-19 concerns were still brought up by the potential jurors during voir dire.
- Only those who claimed financial hardship (even for a 5-day trial) were excused.





# Other Experiences with Civil Jury Trials During COVID-19

- Indianapolis, IN trial (Asbestos/Mesothelioma Oct 6, 2020)
  - Supplemental juror questionnaires
  - In person voir dire and jury selection
  - COVID safety precautions
- Other in-person trials in Texas (Intellectual Property) and Mississippi (Personal Injury)
- Virtual bench & jury trials in Texas, California, Delaware, and Florida
- Hybrid approaches—virtual voir dire, in-person trial

#### **COVID-19 Virtual Trials = Record Nuclear Verdicts?**

 Plaintiff Duane Washington injured on his motorcycle in July 2018 in a 45-car pileup on the I-10 in Tallahassee.

 Accident was reportedly caused by a combination of inclement weather and a speeding Top Auto commercial vehicle.

 Plaintiff sustained life-threatening injuries including a broken pelvis, colon damage and urethra damage and was hospitalized for 6 months.

 Prior to trial, defendant Top Auto rejected a \$1 million settlement offer.

 On October 2, 2020 a Quincy, Florida virtual jury returned a \$411.7 million verdict in favor of plaintiff.
